

Computer Lab Established

By the support from Connection Ubuntu, the first computer lab was established in Nambinzo village.

Through this lab, 100 children and youth are expected to be empowered with ICT skills annually.



We are very Small.

In 2023-2024 we were able to establish a lab where youth will learn ICT for jobs and/or prepare themselves for higher education.

20 have been enrolled expecting to graduate this January.









Financial Summary


As we all know that we are very small. In 2023-2024 our financials were approximately 12,000,000 TZS both funds and in-kind support. Below is the summary how much was raised and where it was spent.

Members fee 10.6% In-kind support 89.4%

Total Revenue


In-kind donations, members fee and donations contributed to approximately \$5,100. 84% was in-kind support of technological items from CU to establish the computer lab in Nambinzo village.



\$510

Overhead Costs

10% of our revenue went towards our daily organization costs; website hosting charges, domain fee, papers and printing, office rent, compliance and official travel.



\$4,590

Program Expenses

90% of funds and in-kind support raised was spent into programs rather than overhead costs. All spent on Computer Lab establishment.

We are very small, we are very simple. Our goals are simple.


